COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

Grade 12 students will meet with Mrs. Melnyk during the school year to ensure that they are enrolled in the appropriate courses to meet the requirements for Graduation.

To qualify for the grad list, students must adhere to the following criteria:

CRITERIA:

- Students entering Grade 12 in September must have accumulated a minimum of 80 credits by February 28, 2017.
- Students must have the necessary required courses or enrolled in the remaining required Grade 12 courses in order to be on the Grad list.
- Any non-diploma correspondence (ADL) courses must be successfully completed, including the final, by April 27, 2017.
- Students must attend classes regularly and on time as per the School Act and administrative policy 350: Student Conduct.

Any student who is withdrawn from the grad list/ commencement exercises may appeal the decision in writing to the principal, subject to the policies and regulations of Elk Island Public Schools.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

THE BUDGET 2017

The grad fee of \$165 will be payable to Vegreville Composite High School by November 7, 2016. This is included on your school fees invoice; however it may be paid separately.

Expenses vary from year to year depending on the decisions of the current grad class. Items such as grad caps and gowns, decorating expenses and the group photo fluctuate. The budget presented below is based on anticipated expenses and is adjusted to the number of grads this year.

Please note the fee does not cover the banquet ticket cost of approximately \$40/person. A banquet ticket is required for each person attending the ceremony INCLUDING the graduand.

^{*} Graduation fees now include the photographer's sitting fee of \$25.00 that was previously paid directly to Lifetouch. It is important for all graduands to have a photograph in their cap and gown. It will be a lasting memory in the yearbook as well as creative display the evening of the graduation ceremony.

Parents are not obligated to purchase packages, however, if they choose to do so, the sitting fee will be credited towards the cost.

GRADUATION GOWN SIZING

Students will be measured for their graduation gowns in February. Further information will be provided via the various formats.

CHARITY EVENT

The Class of 2017 will host a charity event with a portion of the proceeds being donated to the charity of their choice. The event will be organized in consultation with the executive and the advisors. All graduands will be expected to volunteer, along with their parents. The time commitment is approximately three to four hours. Examples of previous events include a bottle drive or car wash. This is an excellent opportunity to give back to the community and spend time with fellow graduands and their families.

GRADUATION TICKET SALES

Tickets will be sold at lunch in the general office on May 2, 3, and 4, 2017. Projected costs for banquet tickets are \$40/ticket which will be dependent on the caterer. All guests require a ticket including the graduand.

Children 7 and under REQUIRE a ticket, but they will NOT be charged. This means they are included in your table count, but they are free.

Tickets are limited to EIGHT per graduand. There are no exceptions.

Payment may be made via debit card, credit card, cash, or cheque payable to VCHS.

Students with any outstanding fees will not be able to purchase banquet tickets.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

Dignitaries, guest speakers, staff, and the executive are seated near the front to allow for easy access to the stage with minimal disruption. Guests requiring special needs (walker, wheelchair) are seated near the foyer entrance. Students that have volunteered for events (Legion Steak Fry, Chamber of Commerce Christmas Party, etc.) receive preferential seating. The table locations for the remaining graduands are placed randomly.

CLASS VALEDICTORIAN

The Valedictorian is selected after first reporting period in second semester (mid-April). This decision is made by administration based on academic standing.

DECORATING

In consultation with the advisors, the Decorating Co-Chairs are responsible for creating an elegant and memorable graduation that reflects their class and follows the framework set out by Elk Island Public Schools.

The Decorating Co-Chairs will organize a committee to decorate the Social Center on Thursday, June 1. Transportation in the form of a flat-bed trailer will be required to haul larger items (stairs, backdrops etc.) from the school to the SC and back again at the end of the ceremony. Parents will also be required to assist with set-up and take down. The Graduation Executive for 2018 will also be helping. Many hands make light work.

REHEARSAL

A mandatory rehearsal will follow decorating, at approximately 2:00 pm on Thursday, June 1. This rehearsal is very important as we run through the program. It will last 90 minutes and is for the graduands only. The girls should wear their shoes to practice walking the stairs.

CLASS OF 2017 PHOTOGRAPH

The group photograph will be taken at the County of Minburn building on Friday, June 2. Please arrive at 3:15 sharp and be prepared to stay thirty minutes. It will take this long to organize the students and take the required photographs.

BANQUET

Time Frame

The doors to the Social Center will open at 4:15. The Ceremony will start promptly at 5:00. Dinner is usually served close to 6:30. The evening ends at approximately 9:30-10:00.

Meal

The meal is buffet-style and usually features a beef and chicken entrée, along with numerous salads and side dishes. Dessert and tea/coffee are included.

Alcohol/Drugs

Graduation is a school event. Any alcohol/drug consumption by graduands, parents, or guests will not be tolerated. Drinking in or around the venue will result in removal from the ceremony, and school consequences will be applied. The RCMP will be patrolling the grounds of the Social Center as well as the Egg Park on graduation day.

Students and their families are encouraged to take photographs in their caps and gowns. The gowns and vee-stoles must be returned. Please hang up the gown on the student's labelled hanger and initial the return sheet prior to leaving the Social Center. Any unreturned gowns or vee-stoles will be charged to the student. The cap is a memento for the student to keep.
